Institute would like to procure the **Supply of Scientific CMOS Camera with Accessories** and for this purpose, **e-Tenders** are invited from the reputed & bonafide Manufacturers and Authorised Dealers/Distributors. **I Techno-Commercial Bid**

- c) **Submission of compliance sheet as per [Annexure-I \(b\)](#)** is essential part of Techno- Commercial Bid. If there is any deviation in specifications of material/ items, record with complete details. Attach separate sheets wherever required. The Institute reserves the right to decide on such deviation/s.
- d) The technical offer should not contain any price information.

- **Opening of part-II (Price) will be intimated later to technically qualified tenderers after scrutiny of Techno-Commercial part.**

5. **Instructions to Bidders:**

(a) If the bid is submitted by authorized dealer/ distributor for branded makes, an authorization letter from principals clearly indicating that the vendor is the authorized to sell and provide services for the items mentioned in the scope of supply given in tender documents shall be produced.

(b) Purchase Orders if any, for identical equipment supplied to other IISERs/ IITs/ Central Universities etc. for the preceding three years should be given together with the prices eventually or finally paid.

(c) Copy of CST/VAT/GSTIN No. and PAN No. allotted by the concerned authorities should be enclosed.

(d) The makes/brand and name and address of the manufacturer, Country of Origin, and currency in which rates are quoted are to be clearly mentioned.

(e) Period of delivery, Period of Warranty should be mentioned specifically.

(f) Training charges (if any) be quoted separately.

(g) Authorized dealer can submit bid on behalf of only one principal/OEM in the same tender for the same item/product.

(h) Bidders are required to mention INR value on the date of submission of tender, in case of foreign currency quotes. This INR value should remain same during the validity period of bid. However, any downward revision is to be passed on to IISER Bhopal.

(i) **Bidders from neighboring countries:** Any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in any procurement whether of goods, services (including consultancy services and non-consultancy services) or works

(including turnkey projects) only if the bidder is registered with the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) as per GOI Order No. F.No.6/18/2019-PPD dated 23rd July 2020

**6. Purchase Preference / Restrictions to/of Local Content and Make in India (applicable for all procurement above 5 lakh) from Class I & Class II category.**

- A. Eligibility for participation in the tender: Only 'Class-I local supplier' and 'Class-II local supplier', as defined under Public Procurement (Preference to make in India) Order – 2017 vide Order No.P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 4th June 2020, shall be eligible to bid. As per Order, the definitions of Local Content, Local Supplier etc. are as under:

**[Local content:** 'Local content ' means the amount of value added in India which shall, unless otherwise prescribed by the Nodal Ministry, be the total value of the item procured (excluding net domestic indirect taxes) minus the value of imported content in the item (including all customs duties) as a proportion of the total value, in percent.

- i. ***Class-I local supplier*** - has local content equal to or more than 50%.
- ii. ***Class-II local supplier*** - has local content more than 20% but less than 50%.
- iii. ***Non - Local supplier:*** - local content less than or equal to 20%.]

- C **Margin of Purchase Preference:** The Margin of price preference shall be 20%.

- D. In the procurements of goods or services or works, the following procedure is to be followed in case of divisible supply:

- i. If L1 is 'Class-I local supplier', the contract be awarded to L1.
- ii. If L1 is not a 'Class-I local supplier', 50% of the order quantity shall be awarded to L1 balance 50% quantity shall be awarded to the Class-I local suppliers (subject to Class-I local supplier's quoted price, falls within the margin of purchase preference) after matching the L1 price in that order. In case of denial for matching L1 price by Class-I local suppliers, 100% quantity to L1 bidder be awarded.

- E. In case, goods or services or works are not divisible, preference is to be given for Class-I local suppliers (subject to Class-I local supplier's quoted price, falls within the margin of purchase preference), in case Class-I local suppliers do not agree to match the L1 price, the 100% quantity Order is to be placed on L1 without splitting.

- F. "Class-II local supplier" will not get purchase preference in any procurement, undertaken by procuring entities.

- G. Bidder must enclose undertaking/self-declaration certificate along with the technical bid (Annexure-VIII)

- H. For item valued more than 10 crores bidders to provide a certificate (Annexure VIII from the statutory auditor or cost auditor of the company (in the case of companies) or from a practicing cost accountant or practicing chartered accountant.

- I. False declarations will be in breach of the Code of Integrity under Rule 175(1)(i)(h) of the General Financial Rules for which a bidder or its successors can be debarred as per Rule 151 (iii) of the General Financial Rules along with such other action as may be permissible under law.

**7. Fundamental principles of public buying as per Ministry of Finance, GOI Order No.**

**F.No.6/18/2019-PPD dated 23rd July 2020.**

- (i) Any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in this tender only if the bidder is registered with the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT).
- (ii) "Bidder" (including the term 'tenderer', 'consultant' or 'service provider' in certain contexts) means any person or firm or company, including any member of a consortium or joint venture (that is an association of several persons, or firms or companies), every artificial juridical person not falling in any of the descriptions of bidders stated hereinbefore, including any agency branch or office controlled by such person, participating in a procurement process.
- (iii) Ill. "Bidder from a country which shares a land border with India" for the purpose of this Order means: -
  - a. An entity incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
  - b. A subsidiary of an entity incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
  - c. An entity substantially controlled through entities incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
  - d. An entity whose *beneficial owner* is situated in such a country; or
  - e. An Indian (or other) agent of such an entity; or**
  - f. A natural person who is a citizen of such a country; or
  - g. A consortium or joint venture where any member of the consortium or joint venture falls under any of the above
- (iv) The *beneficial owner* for the purpose of (iii) above will be as under:

- a. **In case of a company or Limited Liability Partnership, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s), who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person, has a controlling ownership interest or who exercises control through other means.**

Explanation-

- i. "Controlling ownership interest" means ownership of or entitlement to more than twenty-five per cent. of shares or capital or profits of the company; "Control" shall include the right to appoint majority of the directors or to control the management or policy decisions including by virtue of their shareholding or management rights or shareholders agreements or voting agreements;
- b. In case of a partnership firm, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s) who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person, has ownership of entitlement to more than fifteen percent of capital or profits of the partnership;
- c. In case of an unincorporated association or body of individuals, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s), who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person, has ownership of or entitlement to more than fifteen percent of the property or capital or profits of such association or body of individuals;
- d. Where no natural person is identified under (1) or (2) or (3) above, the

beneficial owner is the relevant natural person who holds the position of senior managing official;

- e. In case of a trust, the identification of beneficial owner(s) shall include identification of the author of the trust, the trustee, the beneficiaries with fifteen percent or more interest in the trust and any other natural person exercising ultimate effective control over the trust through a chain of control or ownership.
- (v) An Agent is a person employed to do any act for another, or to represent another in dealings with third person.
- (vi) *[Applicable in case of Works contracts, including Turnkey contracts]* The successful bidder shall not be allowed to sub-contract works to any contractor from a country which shares a land border with India unless such contractor is registered with the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT).

## 8. Other Terms and Conditions

- a) IISER, BHOPAL reserves the right to accept or reject any bid in part or full without assigning any reason whatsoever. The Institute will not hold any responsibility for postal loss or delay of any bid.
- b) **Period of validity of bids:** Bids shall be valid for a minimum period of **90 days** from the date of opening of the Techno-Commercial Bid.
- c) **Delivery Period:** The required quantities of material have to be delivered and installed within 10 weeks from receipt of the Purchase Order.
- d) In case of INR bids the price quoted should be on F.O.R., IISER Bhopal. Govt. Levies like excise duty, sales tax, octroi, WCT etc., if any, shall be paid at actual rates applicable on the date of delivery. Rates should be quoted accordingly giving the basic price, Excise Duty, VAT/ Central Sales Tax etc. Please note that IISER Bhopal is exempted from payment of Central Excise duty vide Govt. Notification No.10/97-Central Excise dated 1st March, 1997.
- e) Being an Educational and Research Institute IISER, BHOPAL is exempted from payment of Custom Duty vide Govt. Notification No.51/96-Customs dated 23rd July, 1996. The Institute shall provide standard exemption certificate on request by the vendor and certificate in any other format may be issued on specific request solely based on discretion of the Institute. Any other commercial terms & conditions mentioned by the vendor will not be binding on the Institute in any way unless agreed specifically beforehand by the Institute in writing.
- f) Bidder shall provide duly signed certificate as enclosed at [Annexure-V](#) with Techno-Commercial Bid. The certificate should be on Rs.100/- NJ Stamp paper.
- g) Completely filled up Integrity Pact placed at [Annexure -VII](#) is to be enclosed. The submission of bid in response to this NIT shall be deemed to be in compliance with all terms and conditions of the tender including integrity agreement by the bidder.
- h) **EMD:** EMD of Rs. **50,000/-** should be in the form of online bank transfer (SBI I-Collect) only in favour of Director, IISER Bhopal. For details logon <https://www.onlinesbi.com/prelogin/icollecthome.htm>. The Techno-commercial Bids must accompany details of EMD payment. No interest shall be paid on earnest money deposited. Bidders having valid registration with NSIC/MSME for tendered item and value may be considered for exemption from EMD amount as per extant rules.

- i) In accordance with the Ministry of Finance Office memorandum No F 20/2/2014 PPD (Pt) dated 25<sup>th</sup> July 2016 the institute may relax condition of prior turnover and prior experiences for Startups and MSMEs subject to meeting of quality and technical specifications on case to case basis.
- j) **Penalty for delayed supply and installation** - Time is the essence of the contract and the supplier shall pay or allow the Institute to realize the sum equivalent to 01(One) per cent of the total order value per week, subject to a maximum limit of 10% of the order value, as agreed compensation for delay for the period during which the supply and installation shall remain incomplete beyond the offered time of completion/execution or beyond the time duly extended in writing by the Institute. The Institute may deduct such damages from any money due to the supplier.
- 9. Payment Term:**  
**For Indigenous items:** 90% payment shall be made against satisfactory delivery and acceptance and balance 10% will be released after successful installation & commissioning subject to submission of S.D. of 3% in form of D.D. / B.G up to warranty period.  
*The bidder must give unconditional acceptance to payment terms and condition, delivery period. Any contrary terms & conditions will not be acceptable unless specifically agreed by the Institute.*
10. **Warranty:** Warranty should be 12 months for the item. Warranty period will start from the date of installation and satisfactory commissioning. Performance security @ 3% of the value of Purchase Order shall be obtained to ensure due performance during warranty period.
11. All the components of equipment should be provided together.
12. Bidder should not be blacklisted, banned or debarred from the GEM or any other Gov/PSU organization in last three years. Notarized document in this regard to be submitted.
13. **Jurisdictions:** The disputes, legal matters, court matters, if any, shall be subject to Bhopal Jurisdiction only.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual covenants contained in this Pact, the parties hereby agree as follows and this Pact witnesses as under:

Article 1: Commitment of the Principal/Owner

#### Article 2: Commitment of the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s)
